Director's Message

Actor Michael J. Fox once said, "Family is not an important thing. It's everything." That quote embodies the classic story, "Little Women." We are proud and excited to bring to the stage a musical version of that story of family and home that forces us to examine life choices when confronted with challenges.

As many know, "Little Women" focuses on the adventurous and head-strong Jo March and her sisters-Meg, Beth and Amy. They dream their dreams with the love and support of their mother, Marmee, and the challenges of their domineering and wealthy Aunt March. Set during the Civil War while their father is serving in the army, the March family perseveres in the face of financial insecurity and other obstacles. The struggles are real and the sisters find solace in each other and having a home.

The impact of home is a recurring theme. The question is whether or not home is it a place of comfort (There's no place like home) or a reminder of what inhibits our dreams ("You can't go home again").

Jo's journeys to and from home force her to confront that struggle. Will she follow her dreams or submit to society's expectations? Can she do both? This production answers that question. If you've read the novel, you know the answer. If not, you will have to wait until the final scene.

In directing this production, I must acknowledge the people who have made it a smooth ride. The cast consistently proved me wrong when I would say, "It doesn't get any better than this? "and then they did. The production team, the off-stage heroes, who never get a bow: Susan Robinson, Kate Adkins, Cass Dasher, Ted Demetriou, Mary Maher, Sharon Benchoff, Ken Johnson, Debby Nagel, Jeff Baer, David Allen and Steve Culver. I must also thank Community Players for this opportunity.


Who's Who Behind the Scenes (Cont.)






